

Chianti Riding, Italy

Itinerary

You can arrive and depart on any day. The minimum stay is three nights.

Arrive at Berardenga in the afternoon, with time to settle in to your room before dinner. Your guides will meet you over dinner and discuss your riding itinerary with you.

There is usually no riding on your arrival or departure day, unless this has been pre-arranged and pre-paid.

The Chianti Riding itinerary offers a relaxed holiday. The riding is tailored to your wishes, and you can combine tuition in flatwork, show jumping and cross country with trail rides around the Tuscan countryside. Please note, trail rides are subject to ability and at the discretion of your guides.



Over a seven night stay you will usually have ten hours of riding, leaving one full non-riding day free to visit Florence. If required, additional riding can be arranged locally.

The surrounding area is a delight to explore in the afternoons. Perhaps visit Siena, the best well conserved medieval town in Italy; or medieval Montepulciano, where you can taste the famous Nobile di Montepulciano wine and visit the town's set of many historical movies. We recommend you have a hire car to make the most of your holiday.



There are many walking routes from the farm, and your hosts are happy to advise on where to go and what to see.

When not riding, walking, exploring or cycling, you can relax around the salt-water swimming pool or in the gardens with the view of the neighbouring castle.
